KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Professor Adrian Davis MSc PhD FFPH FSS FRSA OBE

Professor Adrian Davis is the Director of the NHS Newborn Hearing Screening Programme. After lobbying extensively for the introduction of newborn hearing screening, Professor Davis led the introduction of the programme in England. He now oversees the coordination of the programme nationally.

Since 2004, he has also been Professor of Hearing Communication and Deafness at the University of Manchester and Director of the Medical Research Council's Hearing and Communications Group. Professor Davis began working as a university lecturer in 1975. In 1978 he became an SRC research fellow at the Department of Applied Social Studies, Lancaster Polytechnic and Director of the Medical Research Council's Institute of Hearing Research at Nottingham University. He graduated from the University of Exeter with a BSc in Mathematical Statistics and Psychology. He also has an MSc in Mathematical Psychology, University of Sterling and a PhD in Psychology, University College London.

Professor Davis is Chair of the British Society of Audiology and member of the International Society of Audiology's council. He is also an elected fellow of the Royal Statistical Society and the Faculty of Public Health of the Royal College of Physicians and a fellow of the Royal Society for Arts, Manufacturing and Commerce.

Chair of Sign Language and Deaf Studies; and Director, Deafness Cognition and Language Research Centre

Research Interests

Deaf Studies and sign language research, including sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics, and neurolinguistics

Research Description

My research and teaching interests embrace a wide range of topics related to sign language. These include the linguistics of British Sign Language (BSL) and other sign languages, the history and sociolinguistics of BSL and the Deaf community, the development of BSL in young children, and sign language and the brain. In recent years, I have begun to look specifically at acquired and developmental sign language impairments. I established and now direct the Deafness, Cognition and Language Research Centre, with core funding of £4,000,000 from the ESRC. This is the largest research centre in this field in Europe, with 3 co-directors, and over 30 staff and research students, working in 6 main research themes: language development in deaf children, sign language linguistics, language processing, atypical sign language, face-to-face communication, and the deaf individual and the community. As well as the ESRC grant, current grants as Principal or Co-Investigator include: Improving outcomes for deaf children and their families (National Lottery Fund); Processing Visual Prosody (Deafness Research UK); Imaging the Deaf Brain: functional and structural studies using fMRI (Wellcome Trust).
